C.; June 8, 1918 The 1917 import trade in chemicals was measured largely by what the United States was able to furnish. The year opened with large imports of heavy chemicals and standard goods from the United States, but export restrictions affected the trade very materially in the closing months of the year, particularly the trade in caustic soda, soda ash, glycerin, ammonia, and similar supplies. There was a steadily increasing trade with the United States in all standard drug products, such as quinine, castor oil, iodoform, ipecac, sugar of milk, cyanide of potassium, and various acids, as well as druggists sundries, including dental and toilet supplies, rubber manufactures, fine soaps and lotions, and all similar goods. Export restrictions and high freights, however, combined to force up prices to a point where con sumption was affected. The trade in heavy chemicals will probably return to Great Britain after the war but the introduction of many lines...
