The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010 states that the Secretary [of Health and Human Services] shall define the essential health benefits for certain health plans. The Act further instructs the Secretary to ensure that the scope of the essential health benefits . is equal to the scope of benefits provided under a typical employer plan. The Act requires the Secretary of Labor to conduct a survey of employer-sponsored coverage to determine the benefits typically covered by employers, and to report the results of the survey to the Secretary of Health and Human Services. To meet its requirement, the Department of Labor (DOL) first looked to its ongoing survey of benefits-the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) National Compensation Survey (NCS). The NCS, a survey of employers, provides comprehensive data on employment-based health care benefits. Annually, data from this survey are released on the percent of employees offered employment-based health care benefits and the percent of employees who are actually covered by such benefits.
