The profiles include Bessie Coleman, who became the first African American licensed pilot; Annie Edson Taylor, who was the first to go over Niagara Falls in a barrel and live to tell about it; and Thecla Mitchell, a severely disabled woman who trained for and completed the New York Marathon. Doreen Rappaport is known for her gripping biographies of Americans, both well-known and not yet celebrated, who overcome obstacles to reach their goals. Among her award-winning books are *American Women: Their Lives in Their Words* (an ALA Best Book for Young Adults) and *Trouble at the Mines* (a Jane Addams Honor Book).
