

Excerpt from Mining and Concentration of Carnotite Ores Subsequently, at the suggestion of the institute, a cooperative agreement was made under which the Bureau of Mines undertook to provide the services of skilled chemists and mineral technologists for the supervision of the mining and concentrating of the carnotite, and the National Radium Institute agreed to furnish the necessary funds for mining and concentrating a sufficient supply of ore and for recovering from it the radium, uranium, and vanadium. Under this agreement a radium-recovery plant was built in Denver, Colo. The plant began commercial operation in June, 1914, and when it stopped work in January, 1917, about 8 grams of radium had been extracted. The cost of recovery under the methods devised by the Bureau of Mines was only about one-third the current price for radium. In addition, methods of saving the uranium and vanadium in the ores and of obtaining the metals in a pure state were perfected.
