The ground should be prepared as follows: after plowing the land in the spring, sow broadcast a high-grade fertilizer and work well into the soil. Sow the seed with a garden seeder in rows fourteen inches apart. at the rate of from one to two pounds per acre, depending upon the amount of moisture in the soil. Should the soil he very dry the seed may be soaked until sprouts appear, then dried quickly and sown. When plants have their second leaf, thin to twelve inches in the row. These sowings may be continued a few days apart throughout the entire season. CULTIVATION Start cultivation as soon as the rows can be seen distinctly, using some of the many wheel hoes for this purpose. Continue these cultivations as long as possible without injury to the plants. No one tool will...
