Students As has been true in other school choice programs, not all students offered an OSP scholarship actually used it to enroll in a participating private school. And over the years, some students lost their eligibility for the Program. For example, by 2008-09, a total of 94 of the 1, 387 members of the treatment group were no longer eligible to receive scholarships because they had graded out of the Program, which means that they would have moved beyond 12th grade.
