



## The Effect of Youth Transition and Resource Base on the Labour Market Success of Descendants of Turkish Migrants to Germany

It aims to do so by first introducing a new concept - called the Resource Base - which is derived from elements of Bourdieus work on cultural and social capital as well as Colemans and Beckers notes on human capital and social capital. This concept is then used to investigate potential causes for the disadvantageous labour market positions of descendents of Turkish migrants by focusing on thei rtransitions from school to the labour market and the impact of these transitions on their individual Resource Base, as well as the impact of the Resource Base on labour market success. This investigation employs quantitative methods...
